

In 1954, Stella Ann Matthews married Joseph Allen Pete, Jr. of Crowley. To this union was born a daughter, Reve' Marie.

In 1966 Stella Ann Matthews Pete moved to Albany, Georgia. In 1970 she joined Monroe Street COGIC under the pastorate of the late Bishop J. Howard Dell. As a member of Monroe Street Church, Stella Pete's service has included Sunday School teacher, Senior Choir President, Bible Band member, Women's Department worker and Assistant Church Mother. Within the Albany District of Northern Georgia Jurisdiction COGIC, she served as a District Sunday School Adult Class teacher and District Chairlady. Within Northern Georgia Jurisdiction she served as Chair of the Business and Professional Women's Auxiliary, a Women's Department worker and a member of the State Choir. She was licensed as a Deaconess Missionary in the Church of God in Christ by Supervisor Diane L. Jenkins of Northern Georgia First Jurisdiction during the tenure of Bishop Adrian D. Williams as Prelate. Until the last year of her life, Stella Pete served as Adult Sunday School teacher at the Monroe Street Church, now known as Words of Restoration COGIC, under the pastorate of Bishop Oscar Benton, Jr.

As an educator, Stella Pete served as a teacher at Ross Elementary School in Crowley, Louisiana, Acadia Parish Training School in Rayne, Louisiana and Flintside Elementary School in Albany, Georgia. Other educational services in Albany included Reading Specialist at Lincoln Heights Elementary School, First Parent Coordinator of the Dougherty County Title I Program, Dougherty County's

First Elementary School Assistant Principal (Lincoln Heights Elementary School), Assistant Principal of Lake Park Elementary School, Principal of Flintside Elementary School, Assistant Principal of Sylvandale Elementary School and Principal of the Dougherty County Pre-K Program. After retiring from the Dougherty County School System, she served as a tutor at the Bethel Housing Project in Albany, Georgia.

Stella Pete's professional accomplishments are numerous: Albany Area Council of Reading President; Lincoln Heights Elementary Reading Teacher of the Year; charter member, corresponding secretary, vice president and president of the Georgia Council of International Reading Association; president of the Dougherty County Elementary Principals Association and corresponding secretary of the Dougherty County Retired Educators Association. Her community service included Semper Fidelis Nursery School Advisory Board Secretary.



Stella Pete was a Life Member and a Pearl of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. She was also a member of the Crowley Louisiana Branch of the National Association of University Women.
